Looking for authentic ethnic food, the latest Anita Shreve novel, or wicked cool toys? This town square has it.

- 1. TOT LOT The smallish Medford Toys has a varied selection, but shoppers who favor classic playthings will be especially pleased with its Legos, stuffed animals, puppets, and wooden puzzles. There's also plenty of Red Sox and Patriots attire for young fans. (66 High Street, 781-306-0000)
- 2. A COOL SCOOP Chrome bar stools and soda-fountain glasses evoke the atmosphere of an Art Deco diner that fits the old-fashioned menu at Colleen's Ice Cream and Sandwich Shop. Finishing your meal with a sundae or frappe made with Brigham's ice cream will sweeten the nonretro prices. (61 High Street, 781-395-9575)
- 3. BOOK SMART At Bestsellers Cafe, you can grab a latte, pick out a great read, and rest by the wall of windows overlooking the Mystic River. This independent bookstore has a noteworthy collection of local interest and children's books and offers 30 percent off current New York Times bestsellers. (24 High Street, 781-391-7171)
- 4. CURTAIN CALL Sugarplums, anyone? From December 10 to 19, see the Northeast Youth Ballet's performance of The Nutcracker at the historic 2,161-seat Chevalier Theatre. With tickets only \$18 to \$20 compared to \$25 to \$100 for the Boston Ballet's Nutcracker at the Colonial Theatre you can afford to bring every member of the family. - 5. SPICY BITES If you're in the mood for Sichuan food, with its pungent hot and salty flavors, you can't beat Chilli Garden. It also offers more familiar, milder Mandarin dishes, but the low prices (most under \$10) and creative specials should persuade you to try something fiery. 


